On the Rise bakery opens Sunday

DETROIT — Three years after the Capuchin Soup Kitchen started the ROPE baking program to help men who have been incarcerated or completed an addiction program become men of integrity, they will now open their own bakery.

On the Rise Bakery, 6110 McClellan, near the intersection of I-94 and Gratiot in Detroit, will celebrate a grand opening 2-6 p.m.

Sunday, April 26. The building, which came through the work of the Catholic Pastoral Alliance, will be blessed at 2 p.m.

The bakery will be open 6 a.m.-noon, Tuesdays through Sundays, and the bakers will continue to visit parishes in the Archdiocese of Detroit on Sundays to sell their baked goods.

Fr. Ray Stadmeyer, OFM Cap., said that so far five men have

completed the program, which includes living in community. Some of the men have successfully moved on to other careers, while some stay, honing their new-found skills. Currently, there are five men in the program.

Archbishop Vigneron on beatification board

DETROIT — Archbishop Allen Vigneron, archbishop of Detroit, has become a member of the episcopal advisory board for the cause for beatification of Archbishop Fulton Sheen. Cardinal Adam Maida, archbishop emeritus for the archdiocese, is also a member of the board. The Archbishop Fulton John Sheen Foundation is the official promoter of the cause for Archbishop Sheen's beatification cause.

Archbishop Sheen, who was born in 1895 and died in 1979, was a popular evangelist, radio/TV personality, writer and missionary. His show, "Life is Worth Living," ran 1951-57 during prime-time on ABC and reruns still air on CTND. He also wrote 66 books and 62 booklets, pamphlets and printed radio talks.

In 1952 he received an Emmy Award as television's Most Outstanding Personality in 1952.

The Vatican opened Archbishop Sheen's sainthood cause Sept. 14,

2003, bestowing on him the title "servant of God." In July 2006, the documentation of two alleged miracles through his intercession — one from the Peoria Diocese and one from the Pittsburgh Diocese — were sent to Rome.

If the Congregation for Saints' Causes makes a declaration of the archbishop's heroic virtues, the church will give him the title venerable.

The next step is beatification, after which he would be called blessed; this step requires certification of a miracle attributed to his intercession. The final step is canonization, which requires certification of a miracle occurring after his beatification.
