07/07/2007: Religion, with a twist -- Milwaukee Archdiocese reaches out to young adults with Theology on Tap

MOUNT PLEASANT — Religious congregations of all stripes face ongoing challenges of keeping people involved and active. But in a world jam-packed with all kinds of commitments, responsibilities and diversions, the challenge is particularly formidable in attracting and retaining young adults in their 20s and 30s.

In an effort to reach that demographic, the Roman Catholic Church's Milwaukee Archdiocese for six years has offered a seminar series entitled "Theology on Tap," a speaker series designed to address the spiritual needs, questions and interests of single and married young adults.

The program is offered again this summer, starting this week at nine sites throughout the archdiocese, including locally at the Charcoal Grill and Rotisserie restaurant, 8300 Washington Ave. (Highway 20), Mount Pleasant. The local program will be held at 7 p.m. on Mondays through July. The seminars are free and reservations are not required.

The Rev. Marty Pable presides this Monday over the kickoff Theology on Tap program at Charcoal Grill. The title of his presentation is "What's Good about Being Catholic."

Pable is a Capuchin priest who works as a retreat director and spiritual director at St. Anthony Retreat Center in Marathon. Pable is a priest and psychologist. He has extensive experience counseling and conducting retreats and workshops around the country.

Pable is author of several books including "The Quest for the Male

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Soul” and “A Man and His God.” Through the years he has led numerous retreats at Siena Center in Caledonia, the home base of the Racine Dominican order of Catholic nuns.

Other scheduled presentations in the local Theology on Tap program include:

July 16: “When Things Fall Apart: Advice for Hard Times,” by Angie Bonnett.

July 23: “Why Do Catholics Do That? Inquiring Minds Want to Know,” by the Rev. Don Hying, rector of the archdiocese’s St. Francis Seminary.

July 30: “The Devil Made me Do it! Sin, Temptation and Conscience,” by Dr. Jane Linahan. a teacher at the seminary.

Other archdiocese locations for the Theology on Tap program are: St. Mary Parish, Hales Corners; Three Holy Women Parish (Holy Rosary site), Milwaukee; O’Donoghue’s Irish Pub, Elm Grove; St. Dominic Parish, Sheboygan; Alpine Village Restaurant, Mequon; Thunder Bay Restaurant and Grill, Pewaukee; Randy’s Funhunter’s Restaurant and Brewery, Whitewater; and Derry Hegarty’s Pub, Milwaukee.

The program culminates with a “Wrap Party” on Aug. 5 at Saint Francis de Sales Seminary, 3257 S. Lake Drive, St. Francis.

The prelates of the archdiocese will also play a role in the program.

Archbishop Timothy M. Dolan is the featured speaker Monday at St. Mary Parish in Hales Corners, and Racine native and Auxiliary Bishop Richard J. Sklba presides at the July 25 program in Pewaukee.


